SEVEN NATURAL WONDERS OF INDIA

There are plenty of natural wonders of India that continue to astound and intrigue people from all over the world because of its diversified topography and abundant natural resources.

Lonar Lake :



Also known as 'Lonar Crater' is a National Geo – Heritage Monument which is a Saline Lake located at Lonar, in Buldhana District of Maharashtra. It was created by a meteorite impact about 50,000 years ago. It is one of the four such hyper velocity impact lakes in the world. It has a diameter of 1.2km and is about 137 m below the

Crater Rim. A study conducted by IIT, Bombay found that the minerals found in the lake are similar to the minerals found on the moon rocks. It is a protected Ramsar Site. (A Ramsar Site is a wet land site designated to be of international importance under the Ramsar Convention held at Ramsar, Iran in 1971 under the auspices of UNESCO).

Gandikota Canyon :



Gandikota lies on the right bank of River Pennar in Cuddapah District of Andhra Pradesh. This natural structure is often compared to the Grand Canyon of Arizona, USA. Over time, the Pennar

River carved the pink granite rock of Erramala Hills and formed this canyon.

Marble Rocks :



The Marble Rocks are a gorge along the course of the Narmada river near the city of Jabalpur in Madhya Pradesh. The river has carved the soft marble creating a beautiful gorge of about 8 km in length. The local marble is mined and transported all over India. The local name of the gorge is 'Bandar Kudri' which means 'Monkey's Jumping Place'.

Valley of Flowers :



With a stunning back drop of the mighty Himalayan Range, the Valley of Flowers National Park presents an ethereal view and an unforgettable experience. Spread over 17 sq.km in the Chamoli District of Uttarakhand State, the Valley of Flowers is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Valley is believed to have been discovered in 1931 by three British mountaineers led by Frank Smythe who named it 'Valley of Flowers'. Exotic flowers of over 607 species beautify the valley which is situated 3600 m above sea level.

Living Roots :

Locally known as Jingkieng Jai (Living Roots Bridges), they are ficus based connectivity solution within the sub-tropical forests of Meghalaya known as 'Abode of Clouds'. Grown by indigenous Khasi tribal communities, these structures have withstood extreme climatic conditions for centuries. The underlying knowledge and skill have evolved through generations and continues to be practised even today. They facilitate connectivity in more than 75 remote villages in and near the wettest region of the earth namely Cherrapunji and Mawsynram



Yana Rocks :



Yana Rocks are located in the forests of Katgal Range of Western Ghats in Uttara Kannada District of Karnataka. It is located near Yana village which is considered as the wettest village in the world and second cleanest village in India. Yana is famous for two massive rock formations known as 'Bhairaveshwara Shikhara (120m high) and 'Mohini Sohikara' (90m high) .

During Shivaratri, a car festival is held here. This site was first surveyed by Francis Buchanan Hamilton, a British

officer of East India Company in 1801. It is as World Heritage Site.

Hogenakkal Falls :



Hogenakkal known as 'Smoky Rocks' in Kannada is a water fall on River Cauvery in Dharmapuri District of Tamil Nadu. Carbonate rocks in this region is considered to be one of the oldest in the world. Hogenakkal Falls is mentioned in Sangam literature as 'Thalaineer Aruvi'.

This region was ruled by Adhyaman Neduman.It is a very important tourist attraction in Tamil Nadu and many films have been shot here.

National Science Day : (28 – 02 – 2024)

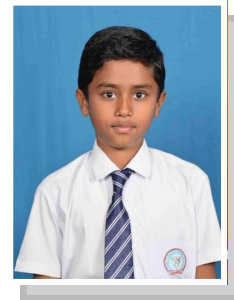
- National Science Day was celebrated in our school on 28th February. The Science and Nature Club students of VIII – std gathered in the Bathija Hall for the celebration.

- Every two weeks, a language disappears taking with it an entire cultural and intellectual heritage. At least 45% of the estimated 7000 languages spoken in the world are endangered. Only a few hundred languages have genuinely been given a place in education systems and the public domain, and less than a hundred are used in the digital world. Tamil is considered as one of the oldest languages of the world still spoken by more than 80 million people. We should strive sincerely to preserve such a classical language with rich literature.



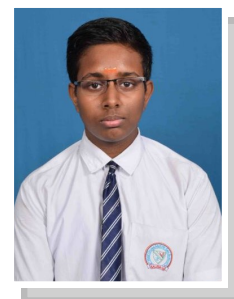

National Science Day

Celebration of Science :

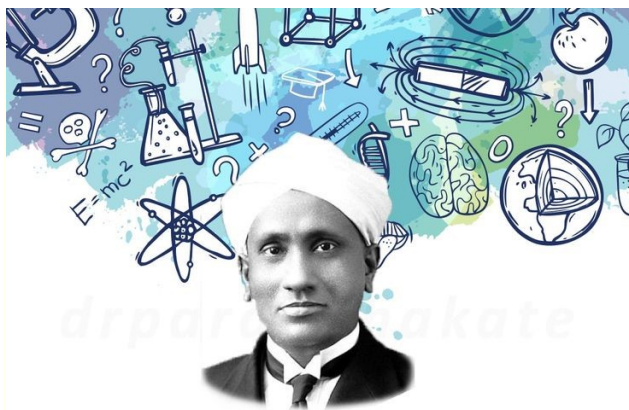
- Every year on February 28th , India observes National Science Day, a day dedicated to commemorate the groundbreaking discovery of the 'Raman Effect' by Indian Physicist Sir Chandrasekhara Venkata Raman popularly known as Sir C. V. Raman. This phenomenon, named after its discoverer, had a profound impact on various fields of science. National Science Day serves as a platform to celebrate scientific achievements and encourage the pursuit of knowledge.

History and Significance :

- In 1928, Sir C. V. Raman announced his discovery of the Raman effect, which revolutionized the understanding of light-matter interaction. This discovery earned him the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1930, marking a significant milestone for Indian Science on the Global Stage. Recognizing the importance of this achievement and fostering a culture of scientific curiosity, the National Council for Science and Technology Communication (NCSTC) proposed February 28th as National Science Day in 1986. This proposal was accepted by the government, and the first official National Science Day was celebrated in 1987.

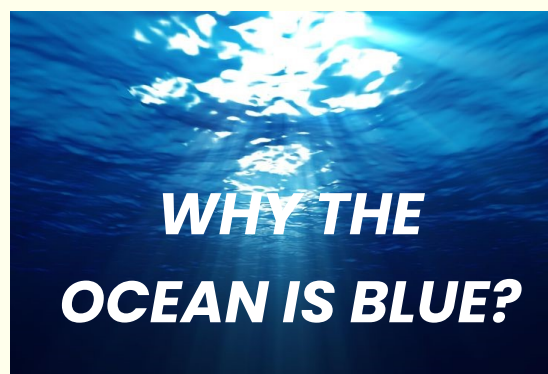
Themes :

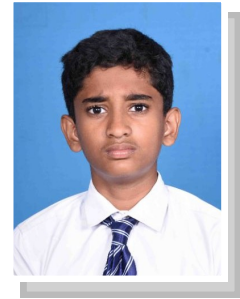
Symphony of Nature

- Belongs to 1974 batch of Matric of Madras University.
- Played for and Captained Salem District Senior Cricket Team.
- In 1979, he was selected to represent Tamil Nadu in the under - 22 category in National Tournaments. He was one of the two players from outside Chennai to be selected for the State Team.
- In 1981, he started his career in Cricket Administration as Executive Committee Member of Salem District Cricket Association (SDCA).
- In 1999, he was elected Secretary of SDCA in which position he served for two decades till 2019.

- He was also elected Assistant Secretary of Tamil Nadu Cricket Association (TNCA) in 2011, in which position he served for five years.
- He was appointed Match Observer of BCCI for India – England T – 20 match in Pune in 2012.
- In 2019, he was elected Secretary of Tamil Nadu Cricket Association for three years and served till 2022.
- It should be noted that he was the first person outside Chennai to have been elected Secretary in the 90 year history of TNCA.
- Founded Salem Cricket Foundation and established a World Class Cricket Stadium near Vala-padi which has hosted several TNPL, Ranji Trophy and Duleep Trophy Games. The ground is now well known and has become a much sought after venue for Indian Cricket.
- Founded Metropole Homes, a leading Apartment Promoter in Salem in 2012.
- He currently serves as the President of CREDAI (Confederation of Real Estate Developers Associations of India), Salem Chapter since 2023.
- He is the son of Mr. R. Subramanian, Proprietor of erstwhile Vilwadi Bhavan, one of the oldest and most famous vegetarian hotels in Salem, known for its quality, taste and variety. It is worth mentioning that the Brothers of Holy Cross bought the Rahm's House property in Yercaud from Mr. Ramasamy's father in the early seventies.

- He is proud of being a product of Holy Cross.

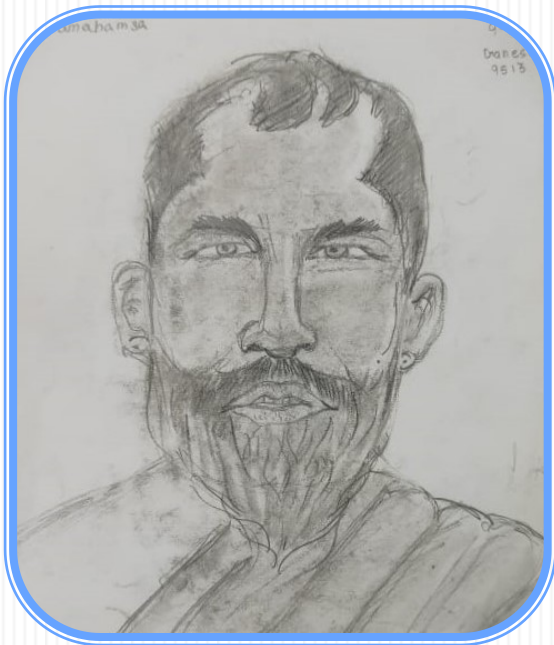
