THE STORY BEHIND THE NAMES OF COUNTRIES



Brazil : The name 'Brazil' is a shortened form of Tierra do Brazil (Land of Brazil), a reference to the Brazil Wood Tree which is found in the coastal areas of South America. It was traded by Portuguese for its dye. It is the National Tree of Brazil. Brazil is the only country in South America where Portuguese language is spoken. The rest of the continent spends mostly Spanish.

Bolivia is named after Simon Boliver, a Venezuelan leader in the Spanish American Wars of Independence. The official name of Bolivia is 'Plurinational State of Bolivia'.

- The Principal thanked all the parents for their presence and Mr. Raja PTA President for sponsoring the motivational talk.












Pongal Competitions. (11th and 12th January, 2024) :


Monthly Holy Eucharistic Celebration (30 - 01 - 2024):

In this connection, it would be useful to know about the suggestions given by Marie Kondo.

Marie Kondo is a Japanese organising consultant, author and TV presenter. She has written four books on organising which have collectively sold millions of copies and translated into several languages. Her best-selling book '**The Life-changing Magic of Tidying up**' earned her great fame and she was named to the 'TIME 100 list of world's most influential people'. She developed a method known as KonMari method, partly inspired by the Japanese Shinto religion.

KonMari Method

KonMari Method is a simple but effective tidying method ensuring that we will never again relapse to clutter. It suggests a unique selection criterion – Choosing what sparks joy – you are not choosing what to discard but rather choosing to keep only the items that speak to your heart. Through tidying, you can reset life and spend the rest of your life surrounded by people and things that you love the most.



SIX RULES OF TIDYING UP

Rule – I – Commit Yourself to Tidying up.

The Konmari method is not a quick fix for a messy room as a once – in – a while approach to tidying. You should first of all be convinced that you should tidy up things and should have a can – do – attitude. The effort is worth it at the end.

`Rule – II - Imagine your Ideal Lifestyle

This method is not about decluttering or making it neat on the spur of the moment for the visitors who come to your home. This is about that kind of house you want to live in The six basic rules of tidying.

RULE 01

Commit yourself to tidying up.

RULE 02 Imagine your ideal lifestyle.

RULE 03

Finish discarding first.

RULE 04 Tidy by category, not by location.

RULE 05

Follow the right order.

RULE 06 Ask yourself if it sparks joy. and what kind of office you want to work in. You don't do it to show off to others. You do it because it brings you joy of living in a congenial atmosphere.

Rule – III – Finish Discarding First

Remember to focus on what you want to keep. All other things have to be discarded Cherish the items that bring you joy and let go of the rest with gratitude, especially the things you have never used. She suggests discarding some sentimental items like some photos.

Rule – IV - Tidy by Category, Not by Location

It might seem sensible to tidy up a shelf, a closet or a room at a time. But tidying up this way will again lead to clutter. So you are suggested to tidy up by category like clothes, books, papers, sentimental items etc.

Rule – V – Follow the Right Order.

You can start with clothes which is fairly easy and end up with sentimental items. As you move with each categorys your energy and enthusiasm increases.

Rule – VI – Ask Yourself If It Sparks Joy

The understanding what kind of environment makes you happy is the most essential criteria for decision making .You pick each item and ask yourself 'Does this sparks joy? "If it does, keep it, otherwise discard it.

Conclusion:

So to conclude, when you tidy your space completely, you transform the scenery. The change is so profound that you feel as if you are living in a totally different world. Let us then try this method to make our life more organized and avoid unnecessary wastage of our time, energy, anxiety and tension.
